#### 4) Requirements and Deadlines

# 4.1.) Rule for undergraduate/mastercourses

Undergraduate students would be better selecting courses at the undergraduate level, while graduate students can select courses both at the undergraduate and graduate level.

#### 4.2.) Rules only for English taught courses

- Enrolment in any specific English taught course in LCU Campus can't be guaranteed. Each English taught course organised in LCU Campus has a limited access to 20/25 students. Students will be selected on the base of date Application and topic of degree consistency with the content of the degree they are enrolled at the Home University.





- The English taught course can be chosen only by Incoming students whose University also provides English taught courses to LCU students. Interested students must request confirmation to Mobility Office of their home University.

# 4.3.) Rules for Language Skills

Erasmus+ Incoming Students' language skills must be appropriate to the courses they're going to attend. The sending Institution, according to inter-institutional agreement, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates so that they have the recommended language skills at the beginning of the study period.

# 4.5.) Students online Application Deadlines

After the acceptance of their nomination, Students receive the Access Code by Link I.R.O., then must complete the online application and submit the signed Application Form along with the following documents:

First Semester/Full Year: Deadline – 31st of July

- Headshot photo in .jpg format
- ID card or passport
- Codice Fiscale (Italian tax identification number): to be obtained applying to the Italian Consular authorities in the Country of Residence
- European Health Insurance Card/private Insurance
- Italian and/or English language certificate, depending on the selected language of study
- PDF Learning Agreement or Online Learning Agreement (OLA).

Second Semester: Deadline - 31st of November





# 4.6.) Semesters start and end dates, and other deadlines

Students are recommended to arrive approximately one week before the beginning of the semester.

### 5). Additional Information

#### 5.1.) Insurance

Students are personally responsible for the Insurance for themselves and their personal belongings. The Insurance should be obtained before the arrival in Italy and should cover costs from illness or an accident. EU students should provide the European Health Insurance Card; Extra EU students should provide private Insurance. Our Institution will provide assistance, when required, in securing Insurance for Incoming and Outgoing staff and students, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.

#### 5.2.) Visa and Residence Permit for non-EU Students

- Non-EU students who need a visa (check this website II visto per l'Italia.esteri.it) will receive from the Erasmus Office a letter of invitation addressed to the Italian Embassy, where they have to apply for a study purpose visa well in advance.
- The Embassy gives the students the links for the pre-registration (mandatory) on the Universitaly Portal (<a href="https://www.universitaly.it/">https://www.universitaly.it/</a>).
- -Within 8 working days from their arrival in Italy, students must apply for the Italian tax code, following the instructions given by the Erasmus Office





# 5.3) Medical assistance, psychological counselling and special needs students

Along with the National Health System services, students can benefit from discounted rates of the health services offered by medical centres, specialist practices, pharmacies and hospitals. LCU also provides students a psychological service, free of charge. Incoming students with special needs can submit the relevant medical certifications to the Erasmus Office, that will contact the Inclusion Unit to request specific support.
